The client's reaction to seeing images of the set that Bill repainted locally recently needs quoting: "Whoohoooooooooooooooooooo!!! Oh my gosh - they look great. I'm comparing them to the other set in the photos I took. I love these. Talk to me. Tell me everything, spare no detail. Let's figure this out. The Little Lightnings are moving to the Hamptons. I'm introducing them to the local native Americans - the Montauket Indians (even though they are all 6 feet under)."
