### Gone Fishing Art from Arnhem Land

Note in your diary this exciting opening next Thursday 31st October at 6pm. The works are ochre on Arches paper and barks and show some wonderful images from the artists of Gunbalanya – also known as Oenpelli – just north east of Kakadu in western Arnhem Land. The last show of similar works in Hobart was back in 1993 when the Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery showed a number of barks in their exhibition “Arnhem Land Dreaming”. We will be featuring another local Tasmanian vineyard – Meadowbank Wines – that evening.

### Blockbuster News Flash.....

Gertie Huddleston and her sister Angelina George will be here in Hobart at our gallery on Monday 4th November for a special showing of their works. They hail from Ngukurr – a small community in eastern Arnhem Land. Gertie’s bright naïve style is in similar vein to that of the recently departed Ginger Riley and put Gertie into the finalists at the Telstra Art Awards in Darwin in 2001. Angelina’s wild floral works are real stunners. We are very honoured to have them here with us on that evening. ### New works

We have had some wonderful paintings in from new connections made in my recent trip to Alice Springs. Some significant works from Papunya and Mount Liebig are here now along with some beautiful prints by Dinny Nolan, Long Jack Phillipus and Paddy Carroll. Bill Harney has at last supplied us with some 11 paintings that fit the budget (\$500 - \$800). He has also flown down a wonderful sculptural piece – an emu chick carved from a tree trunk, applied with natively grasses and emu feathers and finally painted with natural ochres. He tells me that he is carving a big flock of emus for the gallery. We expect Bill to visit us late in January and work in the gallery for some days.

Other new items in stock are a sensational range of shell bracelets from Lola Greeno, engraved slates from Roslyn Karadada of Kalumburu, clapping sticks and CD’s of didgeridoo music by Gary Cannell. Gary was the didgeridoo musician who played at the 2000 Sydney Olympic opening ceremony.

### December exhibition

Wayne Quilliam is putting together the final touches to his photographic exhibition “Is Black White?”. This will be a controversial and interesting show of his poster size prints. We will have a few to show in the gallery to whet your appetite in the next couple of weeks.
