Desert Artists

George Tjungarrayi & Ronnie Tjampitjinpa



These 2 senior artists are amongst the most highly collected Aboriginal artists and their works feature in most collecting institutions. Art Mob has some excellent pieces by both in stock currently ranging from \$1,000 to \$55,000. Hypnotic, holographic, disturbingly wonderful – how do you describe them?



Bead strings and didgeridoos

Some funky seed necklaces have just arrived from the women artists of Titjikala – about 80km south of Alice Springs. These are beautifully presented and range in price from \$40 to \$90. If a necklace isn't the ideal present then maybe a didge. New instruments are in from northern NSW and North East Arnhem Land.

Tiwi Islands artistry

Tokwapi (everything) Tiwi exhibition launches officially at 6pm Friday November 7th. 10 works on paper and 20 canvasses will be supplemented by a few wood carvings.
