Half brother or cousin to the famous late Emily Kame Kngwarreye, Kudditji taught her his style of painting in 1989. Now rapidly gaining recognition in the contemporary art world, this Eastern Anmatyerre artist is often referred to as the Rothko of Australian Aboriginal art.
